 - a. Alison Armstrong and Shirley Borges, Health Care Recruitment Report

Alison Armstrong, Health Care Recruiter for North Wellington Health Care and Shirley Borges, Chair reviewed the Minto-Mapleton Health Professional Recruitment Committee annual report including challenges in 2015 and ongoing recruitment and attraction issues. The new Minto Rural Health Care Centre opens in March and will help attract new medical professionals to the area. They noted changing Provincial programs may affect recruitment efforts and MPP Randy Pettapiece is looking into this. Council asked questions of the presenters and requested staff prepare a letter to the Minister of Health and Long Term Care regarding Minto's unique challenges in recruitment.

b. Dr. Hamid Salsali, Pilot Project, Palmerston Wastewater

Dr. Salsali presented information on the pilot project for the Palmerston Waste Water Plant. This is the first small scale pilot of the system and early results will be brought forward in a few weeks. Dr. Salsali noted that there are no issues with the current Plant operations and that if the pilot is successful a more efficient and effective treatment process is possible. Council asked questions of Dr. Salsali and Mayor Bridge thanked him for his presentation.
