PROJECT OBJECTIVES

Minto RFP 2023-08

"The Cultural Plan (in conjunction with the Cultural Roundtable)
will endeavour to develop a strong and consistent cultural theme
for the Town."

This will be accomplished through:

- Assessment of existing conditions
- Analysis of public opinion and demand for cultural events and attractions
- Confirm the previously created vision and values are still relevant
- Recommend a 5-year strategy and associated timeline to maximize cultural development





MGA PROCESS

The Cultural Plan has been developed incrementally and included the following components:

- Setting the context
- Community and Stakeholder engagement
- Development of Strategic Pillars (Themes) (shared with Cultural Roundtable)
- Draft Recommendations and review with Cultural Roundtable
- Final Recommendations and recommended timeline
