#### c. Announcements

Councillor Elliott noted that the SafeKids Day was held last weekend. Deputy Chief Callise Loos stated there were 640 kids that went to the event with 14 vendors.

Councillor Gunson stated on behalf of Southeast Surge Hockey executive he thanked Minto to allow the ice to remain in May for Try-outs and thanked the staff. Gunson noted this Saturday is the Harriston Firefighters breakfast at the Harriston arena from 7-11 am with entry by donation.

Councillor Dirksen thanked staff for lowering the flags last week to show our sympathy for the grieving families in Walkerton.

Councillor Zimmerman noted that as a part of the Palmerston 150<sup>th</sup> the Harriston Historical Society along with the Palmerston Railway Museum is sponsoring a special headstone and

plaque hunt starting tomorrow. Winners will be announced August 2. Zimmerman also noted that from June 11<sup>th</sup> – August 6<sup>th</sup> a headstone hunt will be held as well by the Harriston Historical Society.

Deputy Mayor Anderson stated that she and Councillor Zimmerman attended FCM where Prime Minister Carney spoke noting most municipalities have the same issues with funding required for infrastructure from upper government. Anderson stated Saturday is the opening of the Palmerston Farmers Market, Harriston Firefighters Breakfast and the Garden Festival with 24 vendors and children's events. Sunday is Pride in the Park in Palmerston. Anderson noted that a community pantry will be placed in the Harriston Library with the Andersons supporting it through funds that come from their annual Christmas dinner.

Mayor Turton noted that Well Initiatives in the Palmerston Industrial Park had a well attended open house. Turton state the Arthur Works garage had a grand opening. Minto Auto celebrated 20 years in business. Mayor Turton thanked the hospital Gala volunteers and welcomed medical students from Kingston who are working in our area. Turton provided a Media Release from the County of Wellington to allocate continuum of care funds to address affordable housing gaps.

CAO Furtney stated that the Mayors and CAO's of Wellington County went to Queens Park and thanked MPP Matthew Rae for pulling this together. The group had the opportunity to speak to the Ministry of Municipal Affairs (Minister Rob Flack), the Ministry of Red Tape Reduction (Minister Khanjin), the Ministry of Transportation (Minister Sakaria), the Ministry of Natural Resources (Minister Harris), and the Ministry of Finance (Parliamentary Assistant Smith). The group also attended Question Period at Queens Park.
